





Highlights

Flex High School Cleveland made valuable community connections and partnerships that will help create wrap-around services in a studentcentered educational environment.

Some highlights include...

The Greater Cleveland Food Bank provides two free, grantfunded **nutrition programs** at Flex High School – the Backpack program providing daily, shelf-sustainable grocery items, and the School market that provides fresh produce monthly to Flex families and community.



In-School **counseling services provided** free for Flex High School Cleveland Students via partnership with Ohio Guidestone



To support development of the HOPE (Helping Our Parentingstudents Excel) program, Flex Cleveland collaborates with Birthing Beautiful Communities to provide free resources and support for parenting/expecting students and/or students who care for younger siblings



Several **local school districts** now refer students directly to Flex to support growth and achievement; Principal Kustron meets monthly with local administration teams to report updates and progress for students referred by neighboring districts













Flex High School Cleveland Community Events

Flex High School engages the school and community with monthly events designed to provide services and resources from the community to help uplift experiences and lives of the entire school community

Flex High School Cleveland Students are Workforce Ready!

Twelve Flex students earned the Ohio Means
Jobs Readiness Graduation Seal and participated
in resume workshops and mock interviews
through a series of workshops delivered
in partnership with volunteers from a local
businesses and nonprofit organizations such
as Dress For Success Cleveland and Youth
Opportunities Cleveland.

Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3314.03(D)(2) specifies that the sponsor of the school must "monitor and evaluate the academic and fiscal performance and the organization and operation of the community school on at least an annual basis."

Buckeye Community Hope Foundation (BCHF) bases its evaluation of school performance on each of the State required indicators and performance measures listed in the charter contract. BCHF monitors the performance of the community school thru attendance at board meetings, bi-monthly visits to the school, monthly reviews of financial reports and quarterly reviews of academic progress reports along with several other reports relative to the school's performance. Buckeye Community Hope Foundation served as the sponsor for Flex High School Cleveland during the 2021-2022 school year and found the school substantially compliant with the rules and regulations governing community schools and progressing towards compliant in academics.

All community school sponsors are required to submit a written report of the evaluation results of the school's academic, financial, and organization performance as well as the school's legal compliance to the Ohio Department of Education and make the report available to parents of students enrolled in the community school. As such, an Annual Report regarding the performance of this school and other schools under the sponsorship of Buckeye Community Hope Foundation will be posted on our website www.buckeyehope.org, no later than November 30, 2022.
